Terry Appointed to Bipartisan Cybersecurity Working Group □

WASHINGTON, DC - Congressman Lee Terry (R-NE) has been appointed by Communications and Technology Subcommittee Chairman Greg Walden (R-OR) to co-head a bipartisan Communications and Technology Cybersecurity Working Group.

The group, composed of Reps. Terry, Eschoo (D-CA), Matsui (D-CA), Latta (R-OH), Doyle (D-PA), and Kinzinger (R-IL), has been tasked with examining the current cybersecurity landscape, and proposing a foundation for the Communications and Technology Subcommittee's efforts to address cybersecurity. Reps. Terry and Eschoo will co-lead the group, and Chairman Walden will serve as an ex-officio member of the group.

“Cybersecurity *is* both national security and economic security. □ Digital information management and protection is at the core of most organizations’ – government and private sector – daily operations. □ Unless American cyberdefenses are airtight, our country is at a competitive disadvantage with the world.

“The impact of a cybersecurity attack cannot be underestimated. □ A major digital strike could undermine our economy. □ Although we haven't recently been attacked, this doesn't mean that we're secure. □ This working group has some serious work before it,

and in the weeks to come, we will lay the groundwork for shoring up American cyberdefenses,” said Terry.
