

WASHINGTON- Congressman Lee Terry has introduced the Renewable Fuel Pipeline Act of 2010, H.R. 4674. This legislation would increase infrastructure to better transport ethanol from the Midwest to other parts of the United States.

"Nebraska relies heavily on the ethanol industry," said Congressman Terry. "This legislation is critical to improving the infrastructure to more efficiently transport ethanol made in Nebraska to other markets across the country."

Facts about the Renewable Fuel Pipeline Act:

- Ø Allows for federally guaranteed loans for renewable fuel pipeline construction for ethanol and biodiesel.
- Ø Allows a maximum guarantee by the Secretary of Energy of at least 80% of the project costs.
- Ø The pipeline would run from South Dakota to New Jersey and would connect to a major existing pipeline system now operating in Nebraska.
- Ø A feasibility study done by POET and Magellan indicate the pipeline would generate \$700 million in federal tax revenue.
