

WASHINGTON - Congressman Lee Terry (R-NE) commented today on the death of Peter Hoagland.

"Peter was a dedicated Congressman," said Congressman Terry. "He was a tough campaigner yet a caring family man. During his three terms in the House of Representatives, Peter was a strong voice for the Democratic Party, not only Nebraska, but the Congress," said Terry.

Former Representative Peter D. Hoagland, an Omaha native, attended Harrison and Dundee grade schools and graduated from Omaha Central High School. He later served as State Senator in the Nebraska Legislature and later as Member of the U.S. House of Representatives from 1989 to 1994. He served on the House Banking and Ways and Means Committees. After his service in the House, he practiced law in Washington, D.C.
