

The energy efficiency of ethanol plants is steadily improving, with modern plants using 20 percent less energy than just four years ago.

That's one of the conclusions of a new study released by the Ethanol Across America education campaign. Senator Tim Johnson of South Dakota, a member of the group's advisory board, says the study debunks outdated and erroneous information on ethanol production.

Congressman Lee Terry of Nebraska says the study shows that biofuels like ethanol can play a key role in reducing carbon dioxide emissions.
