

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) - Nebraska's three House members - all Republicans - have voted against a \$14 billion rescue package for the nation's imperiled auto industry. The legislation was approved 237-170 by the House Wednesday evening.

Rep. Lee Terry of Nebraska's 2nd District calls the bill a handout that won't create the change that's needed

Rep. Jeff Fortenberry of the state's 1st District says he fears the temporary measure only sets up taxpayers for further exposure in the future.

And Rep. Adrian Smith of the 3rd District says policies need to benefit every town in the United States, not just Detroit.

The emergency bailout still faces roadblocks from Republicans in the Senate.
