

WASHINGTON — A congressional dispute over a two-month extension of the payroll tax cut and unemployment benefits threatens to upend a provision, included in both the House and Senate measures, that would require the Obama administration to make a decision on the Keystone XL pipeline within 60 days.

Rep. Lee Terry, R-Neb., has been pushing for a Keystone deadline for months.

After a two-hour meeting of the House Republican conference Monday night, Terry said he would have preferred to see the Keystone provision locked in but said he thinks it will make it through eventually.
